

ER/LA opioids REMS: Achieving Safe Use While Improving Patient Care

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has announced a risk evaluation and mitigation strategy (REMS) for ER/LA opioid products. This REMS course will be offered during the TOMA Convention on Thursday, April 23rd from 2:00pm-5:00pm.

Don't miss this course! This course is open to ALL practicing physicians, and is free of charge. Pre-Registration is required, however, you do not have to sign up for the full TOMA convention to attend! Bring your colleagues to this event!

The course provides 3 AOA Category 1-A CME credit(s). Prescribers who attend the 3 hour-session and take the assessment, which covers the entire U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) Blueprint, will be considered RPC/FDA completers.

ENJOY YOUR STAY IN FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE!

Franklin, a vibrant suburb of Nashville, is a blend of modern and historic, with trendy places to shop and eat and attractions that tell the story of the Civil War Battle of Franklin. The historic downtown district is nationally recognized as a Great American Main Street. Franklin's attractions include Carnton Plantation, Carter House and Lotz House. Arrington Vineyards, owned by music legend Kix Brooks, offers free wine tastings and live music. Franklin is located 20 miles south of Nashville.

TOP 10 THINGS TO DO WHEN YOU AREN'T IN THE LECTURE HALL:

- 1: Visit the 32nd annual Main Street Festival on April 25-26. The free street festival is expected to draw a crowd of more than 125,000 for a weekend full of music, arts and crafts, food, children's activities, and more. The festivities will run Saturday from 10 am to 7 pm. Activities will re-open at 11 am on Sunday and continue until 6 pm.
- 2: Visit Downtown Franklin: Visitors can easily spend a day browsing antique shops and boutiques and dining at one of its many restaurants. Downtown Franklin offers an eclectic mix of antique shops, gift and book stores, art galleries and clothing boutiques.
- 3: Visit historic sites such as: The Carter House, The Lotz House Museum, and the Historic Carnton Plantation.
- 4: Visit the Factory at Franklin: a 12-building dining, retail and entertainment complex listed in the National Register of Historic Places. As you spend your day at The Factory, take some time out to notice the historical factors of this building.
- 5: Shopping: Cool Springs Galleria is located just minutes from the hotel, and has shopping for the entire family.
- 6: Exercise: Take a walk through picturesque Aspen Grove Park.
- 7: Dining: Experience all the local eats- from authentic barbeque, "meat & three", fried green tomatoes to oysters and gumbo!
- 8: Art: Visit Gallery 202 or the David Arms Gallery. Also try your hand at making art by taking classes at the Franking Glassblowing Studio.
- 9: Relax and Renew: Franklin has world-class salon and day spas located minutes from the hotel.
- 10: Take the 20 minute drive to Downtown Nashville, and experience "Music City".
